# REV. DR. ROBERT MOSES b. December 2, 1971

I was born Lakewood, Ohio (Cleveland area) in 1971 to Robert and Mary Ann Moses. My father's work for a communications/aero-space technologies company (Harris Corp) moved our family to West Melbourne, Florida, in 1978. My mother, an elementary school PE teacher for much of her life, died in 1989. In 1991, my father married Carmela (Camille) Mazzela. I have one brother, a year older, who lives in Chicago, and two stepbrothers who live in Detroit and New York City, respectively. My father died in 2005. My step-mother still lives in Melbourne.

I graduated from Melbourne High School (*Go Bulldogs!*) in 1989 and from Florida State University (BS, Economics and International Affairs) in 1992. After university, I entered seminary, training for the priesthood for the Diocese of Orlando (Roman Catholic) at Saint Vincent de Paul Seminary (1992-1995) in Boynton Beach, Florida, and the North American College (1995-2000) in Rome, Italy. While in Rome, I studied at the Jesuit Gregorian University, eventually earning both a Bachelor of Sacred Theology and a Lisence (Master) of Sacred Theology, focusing on biblical studies and ancient languages.

I was ordained to the Sacred Order of Deacons in 1998 and to the Sacred Order of Priests in 1999, both in the Roman Catholic Church under the authority of Norbert Dorsey, bishop of Orlando. I left ministry as a Roman Catholic priest in January 2003, having served at Saint Joseph Catholic Church and Santa Fe Catholic High School, both in Lakeland.

After leaving the Roman Catholic Church, I met Nancy Murphy Brink. We were married in September 2003. Nancy works as the Vice President of Provider Services for the Early Learning Coalition of Polk County. Nancy and I have two children: Emma and John, both graduates of Harrison School for the Arts. Emma is now in law school at Georgetown University and John is studying physics at the University of Central Florida.

Nancy and I were both received into the Episcopal Church by Bishop Hugo Pena-Lopez in 2004 at Saint David's. I returned to active ministry in 2005, as chaplain and religion teacher at All Saints' Academy and then as Director of Faith Formation at Saint David's. In 2008, on the Feast of Pentecost, the Rt. Rev. John W. Howe officially accepted my sacred orders from the Roman Catholic Church and received me as priest in the Episcopal Church.

That year, I took the position of assistant at Saint David's, a post I held until 2012. After the Rector resigned, I was made Priest-in-Charge and, eventually, Rector. While at Saint David's, I matriculated as a doctoral candidate at Virginia Theological Seminary, from which I graduated in 2014, with a doctoral thesis titled *Storytelling as a Precursor to Evangelism*.

### The Third Sunday after the Epiphany January 21, 29024

#### The Collect

Give us grace, O Lord, to answer readily the call of our Savior Jesus Christ and proclaim to all people the Good News of his salvation, that we and the whole world may perceive the glory of his marvelous works; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. *Amen*.

#### Old Testament-Jonah 3:1-5, 10

The word of the LORD came to Jonah a second time, saying, "Get up, go to Nineveh, that great city, and proclaim to it the message that I tell you." So Jonah set out and went to Nineveh, according to the word of the LORD. Now Nineveh was an exceedingly large city, a three days' walk across. Jonah began to go into the city, going a day's walk. And he cried out, "Forty days more, and Nineveh shall be overthrown!" And the people of Nineveh believed God; they proclaimed a fast, and everyone, great and small, put on sackcloth. When God saw what they did, how they turned from their evil ways, God changed his mind about the calamity that he had said he would bring upon them; and he did not do it.

#### The Psalm-Psalm 62:6-14 Nonne Deo?

- 6 For God alone my soul in silence waits; \*truly, my hope is in him.
- 7 He alone is my rock and my salvation, \*my stronghold, so that I shall not be shaken.
- 8 In God is my safety and my honor; \*God is my strong rock and my refuge.
- 9 Put your trust in him always, O people, \*pour out your hearts before him, for God is our refuge.
- 10 Those of high degree are but a fleeting breath, \*even those of low estate cannot be trusted.
- 11 On the scales they are lighter than a breath, \*all of them together.
- 12 Put no trust in extortion; in robbery take no empty pride; \*though wealth increase, set not your heart upon it.
- 13 God has spoken once, twice have I heard it, \*that power belongs to God.
- 14 Steadfast love is yours, O Lord, \*for you repay everyone according to his deeds.

#### The Epistle-1 Corinthians 7:29-31

I mean, brothers and sisters, the appointed time has grown short; from now on, let even those who have wives be as though they had none, and those who mourn as though they were not mourning, and those who rejoice as though they were not rejoicing, and those who buy as though they had no possessions, and those who deal with the world as though they had no dealings with it. For the present form of this world is passing away.

#### The Gospel-Mark 1:14-20

After John was arrested, Jesus came to Galilee, proclaiming the good news of God, and saying, "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; repent, and believe in the good news." As Jesus passed along the Sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and his brother Andrew casting a net into the sea—for they were fishermen. And Jesus said to them, "Follow me and I will make you fish for people." And immediately they left their nets and followed him. As he went a little farther, he saw James son of Zebedee and his brother John, who were in their boat mending the nets. Immediately he called them; and they left their father Zebedee in the boat with the hired men, and followed him.
